## ENROLMENT AT FAIRFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR NEW STUDENTS

The Fairfield Primary School Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Fairfield Primary School for the period:

## 23rd July to 28th September 2018 (Term 3 2018)

Enrolment at the school is governed by an Enrolment Scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The Board has determined that a total of 6 places are likely to be available for **OUT OF ZONE** students during this period. These places are only available for Year 0 children (New entrants).

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's enrolment zone. There are no out of zone spaces for year 1-6 children for Term 3, 2018.

Application forms are available from the school office.

# The deadline for receipt of application for Out of Zone places is: 27<sup>th</sup> June 2018

Parents who live within the home zone and who intend enrolling their child in Term 3 should notify the school office by 27<sup>th</sup> June to assist the school in planning appropriately for this period. All students in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school. The ballot only affects students who live out of zone.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot.

If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2018. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.



## A little about me...


I have lived locally for nearly 20yrs, been married for over 30yrs, mum to 3 grown up kids and a proud Grandma to 4.
