Support your child's success. Make sure they attend school, all day, every day!

EVERY MINUTE COUNTS!

Being late for school has a negative impact on your child's learning.



Being just 10 minutes late every day adds up to an hour a week of lost learning. Over a year this adds up to one week of school missed in a year!

Being late for class often means important instructions are missed and the class is interrupted. Your child may feel uncomfortable and on the outer with peers.

Children need to arrive on time ready to settle into their school work. Arriving at least 5 minutes before the first bell allows your child to interact with their peers and teacher and get themselves ready for their busy day.

Attending School regularly and arriving on time helps prepare children for the real world, where it is expected that they turn up to work every day and on time.

If you don't have internet access, school office staff can provide you with printed copies of the policy and a review form.

ENROLMENT AT FAIRFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL FOR NEW STUDENTS

The Fairfield Primary School Board of Trustees invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their children at Fairfield Primary School for the period:

28th April - 3rd July (Term 2 2020)

Enrolment at the school is governed by an Enrolment Scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

The Board has determined that a total of 7 places are likely to be available for OUT OF ZONE students in Years 1-4. The exact number of places in each year level will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's enrolment zone. There are no spaces available in Years 5 – 6 for Term 2.

Application forms are available from the school office.

The deadline for receipt of application for Out of Zone places is: 2nd April 2020.

Parents who live within the home zone and who intend enrolling their child in Term 2 should notify the school office by 2nd April to assist the school in planning appropriately for this period. All students in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school. The ballot only affects students who live out of zone.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available in each year level, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot for out of zone places is required, it will be held on 7th April 2020. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.


