Children who miss 3 or more school days in each fortnight are considered "cronically absent" and can expect home visits and/or agency intervention.

It is also important to have children at school on time everyday and remain at school until 2:30pm. Children who arrive after the 8:40am bell must report to the office to collect a late slip. This ensures they are taken off the absentee list. Parents of children who are consistently late will be followed up on.
